Making a difference...

One of the St Gemma's community nurse specialists recently cared for our Mum. We want to let you know what a big difference she made to our family and our confidence. None of us had caring experience and she helped us through the difficult journey together.

She was so caring to our Mum. She listened, she gave us great advice and support, what to expect and how we could get in touch. In the end we had a lovely 9 days at

home with our Mum. That was priceless to us. We laughed. We cried. We watched Emmerdale, three in a bed drinking sherry! She saw her friends for the last time, sat serenely in her bed ringing her little bell for tea to be delivered. She died in her favourite place - her own bed, her own bedroom, in her own home. We are all devastated but know she had the best death that she could have had thanks to

St Gemma's." (Recent feedback from a patient's daughter.)

Grief affects us all in different ways at different times.

Whenever one of our patient's loved ones is affected by the pain of loss, St Gemma's staff are there, skilfully helping each individual to learn to live with their bereavement.

It costs £630 a day to keep our specialist bereavement service running.

Special Occasions Planner

We deal with preparing the food, drinks, cake, decorations and anything else we can to make the day memorable.

Melanie Bastow has worked at St Gemma's Hospice for 8 years. She works in the Hospice's Bistro, serving refreshments to staff, volunteers and visitors. But Melanie also has another very special role at the Hospice – organising special events for patients and their loved ones. She explains:

'We are often asked to help arrange a special event for a patient or their loved ones. We've had weddings, Christenings, anniversaries and birthday parties at the Hospice.

I spend some time with the patient and their family to find out their wishes and needs. Time is of the essence for some of our patients so I work quickly with my colleagues to organise the event.

For some people facing the end of their life, it's the little things we can do that can make such a difference.

Whatever someone wishes, the St Gemma's team will do whatever we can to try and make it happen.

It's a privilege to be involved with patients and the events are often very moving. I'm just pleased I can play a part in helping people to celebrate something special at a very difficult time in their life.

St Gemma's is not just about the expert clinical care. It's about helping people to enjoy each day and that is what makes us so special.'

Parliament celebrates hospices

ne of our Healthcare Assistants, Karen Clarke, recently represented St Gemma's at an event to recognise and celebrate the work of hospices at the Houses of Parliament. Karen tells us more:

'I felt very privileged to be asked to represent St Gemma's at the Hospice Celebration Reception at Speaker's House in London recently. I had to be at Portcullis House for 5.45pm to go through security - security was just like going through Manchester Airport. There were approximately 60 other guests, mainly women. We were taken through to the stunning state rooms ready for the reception at 6pm. The speakers included Baroness Illora Finlay of Llandaff and Dr Sarah Wollaston, who are real advocates of palliative care. The speeches were about celebrating and thanking everyone for all the hard work we do in our roles every day. A true appreciation of all we do day in, day out, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. I felt enormously proud to be part of what we do here at St Gemma's.

After the speeches we were then able to speak to other guests and our MP

representative. Our local MP Fabian Hamilton attended and we spoke about my role within the Hospice and he applauded the amazing work we all do. The aim was to get palliative care recognised for what it does and to make sure it is available to all at the end of life.

Canapés and wine were offered all through the reception and we were all well looked after. The two hours flew by and I thoroughly enjoyed my trip and the reception. I really loved the opportunity to help celebrate the amazing work that goes on at St Gemma's.'

Nurses on Tour

Members of the St Gemma's senior Nursing team visited branches of our charity shops recently to meet with shops' staff, volunteers and members of the public. We invited people to come along and meet the team and hear more about the work of the Hospice, what we do, who we care for and how patients can access our services.



As a local charity that relies on the goodwill and generosity of our loyal supporters, St Gemma's Hospice is committed to fundraising in a way

which inspires people to support us and protects our donors and their personal information. We thought you might be interested to hear about how we do this:

- We keep all information that you share with us completely secure.
- We never sell your details to any other organisation.
- All of our communications with supporters offer the opportunity to easily opt out.

- If we plan to telephone a supporter and ask for donations, we will send them a letter beforehand giving them the opportunity to opt out of telephone calls.
- We are especially careful and sensitive when engaging with anyone who may be vulnerable, elderly, bereaved or affected by illness.

We need to raise over
£6 million each year in order to care for local people facing a life threatening illness but we never employ pressive fundraising

aggressive fundraising tactics. All contact with our valued donors, whether by phone, letter or in person is always conducted in a caring, aspiring and professional manner, in line with the Hospice's values.

Reaching out to our community

Leeds Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) to allow us to run a project to research and develop palliative care services with the Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic communities in the Leeds 7 area. We will be working in partnership with Leeds Involving People to engage with these communities and to better support their palliative and end of life care needs. The project is in its early stages but we look forward to sharing our progress as it proceeds.

Training future experts

St Gemma's Hospice Academic Unit of Palliative Care has successfully delivered training in palliative care to healthcare professionals in collaboration with the University of Leeds for more than 15 years. Built on this experience, the Post Graduate Certificate in Palliative Care programme is being delivered for the first time this year. On completion of this programme students receive the award, which is 60 credits at a Masters level of study.

The Post Graduate Certificate in Palliative Care is aimed at healthcare professionals who specialise in palliative care or work predominantly with patients requiring palliative care. The programme is taught by academics and clinicians based in the Hospice who are experts in their field of practice. The students undergo a variety of assessments to test both their knowledge and skills. This includes written assignments, a poster presentation and an Observed Structured Clinical Examination

(OSCE). In the OSCE actors are used to simulate actual patients to emulate real situations. This first batch of students will complete their certificate at the end of the year and so far have reported positively on their learning experience.

Mobile Medication

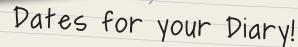
Thank you to the amazing staff at Interior Goods
