Your fundraising is so important



You will notice we haven't asked for a registration fee this year, but instead would like to focus on your fundraising and

how you can help raise money for the Hospice in your local community and celebrate the lives of those you have loved and lost.

Can you ask for donations in memory of your loved one to take on the Sunset Walk? We are asking for a minimum of £50 per person which will help cover the costs of such a wonderful event, and also go towards the specialist end of life care provided by the Hospice.

Are you taking part in the Sunset Walk in memory of a loved one?

If you are, we wanted to let you know that you can set up a tribute page in their honour.

A tribute page is a free and lasting way to celebrate someone important to you. It's an online space where you, your family, and friends can come together to share cherished photos, memories, and messages. You can use it to record your fundraising journey and special moments, all in one place.

You can also use the page to fundraise, but there's no obligation to do so. All donations will support the Hospice in providing expert care to our patients and their families.

How your fundraising helps

£500

pays for a patient or their carer to benefit from a visit to St Gemma's Out-Patients to have a consultation with a doctor, enjoy a therapy session, or take part in a group activity

£250

pays for a St Gemma's community nurse or doctor to visit a patient in their own home and provide clinical advice and support

£100

could provide a specialist bereavement support session for someone struggling to cope with the loss of a loved one

£50

pays for an hour of expert end-of-life care

Gift Aid

A simple but often overlooked way of boosting your fundraising total. Anyone making a donation, who is a UK taxpayer, can Gift Aid their donation. Make sure they tick the Gift Aid box and provide their name and address so we can claim back an extra 25p for every £1 they donate.

Match Funding

Ask your workplace if they can match fund your fundraising efforts. Just ask your HR or finance team if they have this charitable scheme.

Shout about it

You're doing something incredibly worthwhile, let everyone know. Use social media to shout about your amazing fundraising, let all your family and friends know what you are doing and why. Remember to include a link to your JustGiving page!

The easy way to raise even more money for St. Gemma's Hospice

Gift Aid means that St. Gemma's Hospice can claim an additional 25p from the HMRC for every £1 donated by a UK Tax Payer. We need only the sponsor's name, full private address and postcode plus a tick in the Gift Aid Box by the sponsor. We can do the rest. There is no extra cost to the sponsor and their tax status is not affected. By ticking the Gift Aid box your sponsors are confirming that they are a UK Income or Capital Gains taxpayer and they agree with the following information.

I have read this statement and want St Gemma's Hospice to reclaim tax on the donation on this sponsorship form, given on the date shown. I understand that if I pay less Income Tax or Capital Gains Tax in the current tax year than the amount of Gift Aid claimed on all of my donations it is my responsibility to pay any difference. I understand the charity will reclaim 25p of tax on every £1 that I have given.

e.g. you give £10 – HMRC gives £2.50 – St. Gemma's Hospice gets £12.50
