We know it's not always easy asking for donations, but this handy guide lists fun ways you can even raise more! You'll see how easily it can add up and how much it will help local patients and their families.

£50

Bake Sale - £50

Get baking and sell homemade cakes to friends and colleagues for £1 each

£250

Quiz Night - £200

Organise a quiz with 25 people for £8 a ticket

£300

Dress Down Day - £50

Charge your colleagues £2 to take part or see if your children's school can organise a non-uniform day

£250

will pay for a St Gemma's Community Nurse to visit a patient and care for them in their own home

£390

Raffle - £90

Raffle donated items at a local fair, community centre or in your workplace

£450

Night In - £60

Swap a night out for a night in with friends, then donate the money you've saved

£1,044

will pay for a full 24 hours of care for a patient staying in the Hospice

£630

Dine at Mine - £130

Invite friends over for dinner and ask them to pay what they feel it's worth

£500

Car Boot Sale - £50

Have a clear out and sell your second hand goodies at a car boot sale

Auction of Promises - £70
