Jane's family says thank you with appeal boost

The Jane Tomlinson Appeal, set up by the late Jane Tomlinson and family has helped our Refurbishment Appeal get off to a flying start. The special Appeal, which was launched recently to improve patients' bedrooms at the Hospice, received a staggering donation of £37,500 from the Jane Tomlinson Appeal. The cheque was recently presented by Jane's husband Mike, to acknowledge the care Jane received during her final days at the Hospice in 2007.

Mike Tomlinson explained: 'Jane spent the last three weeks of her life at St. Gemma's. She died peacefully and the care was brilliant, we couldn't have asked for more. The team looked after us so well. But we were aware of some of the shortcomings in the bedrooms. When the chance came to help, instantly there was no question that we would. We are very proud to be able to support this refurbishment.'

The Refurbishment Appeal was launched this summer to raise the £339,000 needed to make vital improvements to the patients' rooms on the In-Patient Unit, including installing hoists, revising colour schemes to give better contrast to those patients with dementia or visual impairment and improving flooring to minimise infection risk and reduce the possibility of falls.

St. Gemma's Chief Executive, Bill Kilgallon said: 'We are immensely grateful to the Jane Tomlinson Appeal for this generous donation, which will certainly benefit our patients. The 20 In-Patient rooms catering for 32 patients need complete refurbishment due to an increase in the level of dependency of our patients, advances in equipment, technology and significant developments in infection control. The improvements will increase patient safety, enhance dignity, privacy and provide our patients with more control over their environment.'

Work will be undertaken in eight phases so that the Hospice can continue to provide its vital care to as many patients as possible throughout the refurbishment. The whole project is scheduled to be complete by April 2011. The total cost of the planned refurbishment is £735,000. A contribution of £396,000 has already been secured from the Department of Health which means the remaining £339,000 has to be raised by The Refurbishment Appeal.

Many thanks to everyone who has contributed to The Refurbishment Appeal so far. An amazing £141,280 has been raised. Work has now begun on refurbishing our patients' bedrooms.

I'd no need to worry as they were made to feel very much at ease, considering the situation, and often referred to the Hospice as 'Dad's hotel'. This was always a very happy day for us as a family, giving Mark presents and cards and

24 Glorious Years



Mary Curl has worked as a nurse at St. Gemma's Hospice for 'twenty four glorious years.' This September, Mary will be retiring and we asked her to reflect on her time at the Hospice over the past three decades.

Mary told us: "The Day Centre at St. Gemma's in the late 1980s was just that, a place for the (mostly) elderly to have a bath and a game of bingo. There was little palliative care, no admission or discharge policies, no multi-disciplinary team, little medical support and very poor quality surroundings. We were the 'Cinderella Service', and commanded little respect from anyone.

How things have changed! Today, I lead the Day Hospice team within St. Gemma's Day Services. We work in a well equipped, beautiful environment, specialist providers working in a great team of professionals. It is a rapidly and ever-changing service as it has to maintain its reputation as a centre of excellence. My career changed hugely when I came to St. Gemma's. I have been able to be the kind of nurse I intended to be when I qualified, and for that privilege I thank every member of staff, paid and unpaid, and every patient and their families, with whom I have had contact, from the bottom of my heart."

Behind the facts ...

St. Gemma's Hospice cares for thousands of patients and their families each year. We have 228 members of staff and over 600 volunteers. We provide all of our services free of charge, and it costs £21,750 to run St. Gemma's Hospice each and every day. But behind all these facts and figures is a much bigger picture. Here are some facts about St. Gemma's Hospice, and what they really mean ...

Fact: Last year, the Hospice had 620 In-Patient admissions



Brenda Regan is a Healthcare Assistant on the Dales Ward. She is first into a vacant bedroom to start preparing it for our next patient admission. Brenda explained:

“ We have a busy ward and regularly welcome new patients. We work hard to make sure that their first impressions of St. Gemma's are positive and that their environment is clean and tidy. Every new patient is met by a Nurse or Healthcare Assistant and they are introduced to the team who will be caring for them. I know that some people may be apprehensive when they arrive so I do everything I can to help the patient and their family to settle in. ”

Joanna Morris is a Housekeeper on the Dales Ward:

“ As soon as one of the bedrooms becomes vacant, it is my job to clean it from top to bottom. I thoroughly clean every surface, skirting board and steam the carpets. I get a lot of satisfaction knowing that the room is pristine ready for our next patient admission. ”

“ I know that St. Gemma's cares for lots of patients but I felt like I was the only one on the ward. Nothing was too much trouble and I felt a big sense of relief. ” *Quote from a patient*

Fact: Last year, the St. Gemma's Community Nurse Specialists made 3,303 visits.



Julie Kaye is one of the St. Gemma's Community Nurse Specialists. Julie says:

“ Lots of people still think that hospices are all about the actual building, but they are so much more than that. We work closely with patients who are living at home and we help to manage their symptoms so that we can maximise their quality of life for as long as possible. I feel privileged to be able to help fulfil a person's wishes to stay at home. ”

“ It is so important for me to stay at home with my family for as long as I can. Yet I am reassured to know that I am under the Hospice's supportive and caring wing... ”

Fact: In a recent staff survey, 100% of staff said that the Hospice was a good place to work.



A member of staff commented:

“ I value working in an organisation that invests in training and education. We are encouraged to develop our skills, which is good for us and most of all good for our patients... ”

Fact: There were 1,635 attendances to St. Gemma's Day Services last year.



Carol regularly attends St. Gemma's Day Hospice and said :

“ Coming to the Day Hospice and meeting others in the ‘same boat’ has given me more strength than you could imagine. ”

Mary attends St. Gemma's as an Out-Patient :

“ I actually look forward to coming to see the Doctor! The whole experience is more relaxing and the environment is peaceful. The care and support I receive is second to none. ”

Fact: We served over 35,000 meals to patients last year.



Gloria is a Hospitality Assistant on our Moors Ward. She said :

“ We do our very best to provide an individualised meal service to our patients. Sometimes a patient may have a poor appetite and we will suggest some light meals that they may enjoy. Or a patient may have a special request or favourite meal and the catering team will always try to fulfil their wishes. ”

In-Patient, Christine, recently told us :

“ They made me whatever I wanted and gave alternatives until they found something for me to really enjoy. I have just eaten the most delicious haddock and mash and enjoyed every mouthful. ”

Fact: 42% of patients admitted to St. Gemma's Hospice return home.



Eileen Aspinall, Discharge Co-ordinator, told us :

“ We are responsible for making the plans to help patients to go home. Very often, patients come to our In-Patient Unit for a short period so we can help them with pain relief or symptom control. When they no longer require our care and are ready to go home, my colleague Julie and I work with a variety of people to make any necessary arrangements. We may help arrange suitable transport, special beds and equipment, or medication. We ensure the patient's house is safe and assess if any adjustments are needed. We know how important it is for patients to get back home so we work hard to make their discharge as efficient as possible. It is satisfying knowing we have helped a patient return home. For every patient who leaves us we are able to welcome someone new. ”

“ It meant a lot for me to go home and they organised everything really well. It made my life much easier ... ” *Quote from a St. Gemma's patient*

Fact: The team provided 1504 bereavement support sessions in the last year.



“ The Hospice didn't just care for my mum; you cared for the whole family and we will always be grateful for your kindness and support at a very difficult time. It is very reassuring to know that your team are there for us, if and when we need some ‘moral support’ in the future. Thank you. ” *Daughter of a patient.*


