Taste of Olympics for Hospice

Staff, volunteers, patients and supporters were given the chance to take part in a bit of Olympic history at St. Gemma's Hospice this summer. Proud Leeds torchbearer Barry Hughes kindly gave others a chance to hold the Olympic torch when he attended the Hospice's annual Garden Party in July.

Helen Swift from the Hospice's admin team said, "It was so exciting to hold the torch and meet the torchbearers – a once in a lifetime experience. It was such a nice idea to have the torch travelling throughout the country as it has really engaged with communities and made us all feel part of the event. It was really kind of Barry to share his moment with everyone at the Hospice."

Barry was one of 8,000 inspirational torchbearers who took part in the 70 day torch relay across the UK. Barry is a founding member of TrekToTheSky which has raised over £30,000 for charities, including St. Gemma's, in just two years. He has taken part in a trek of the Inca Trail and a 100km trek across Iceland and has reached the summits of Mount Kilimanjaro and Mount Aconcagua.

Barry said, "Someone close to me was cared for by St. Gemma's Hospice and we wanted to give something back. The Olympic festivities have been amazing for bringing communities together and that's what St. Gemma's believes in."

National coverage for St. Gemma's Professor

Caring for patients and their families remains our priority, however, St. Gemma's Hospice believes that the key to making significant improvements in patient treatment is through advancements in medical and other healthcare interventions. This can only be achieved by undertaking high calibre research in the field of palliative and end of life care.

Professor Mike Bennett, St Gemma's Professor in Palliative Medicine was a member of the expert group that helped develop new guidance published by the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE) in May and was interviewed by the BBC for their Ten O'Clock news on May 22nd and on BBC Breakfast the following morning.

The new clinical guideline is on the safe use of opioids, medications that relieve pain, recognised by the World Health Organisation as essential in the treatment of severe pain. The new NICE guideline should help to ensure that when patients receiving palliative care for chronic or incurable illnesses start treatment with strong opioids, the drugs are prescribed safely and consistently.

Professor Bennett also authored a summary of the guidelines published in the British Medical Journal on May 25th. Commenting on the document Professor Bennett said, "Until now, there has been little guidance regarding the safe prescribing of opioids, especially when the treatment is started by non-specialists such as GPs or hospital doctors not familiar with these types of medicines. Despite the increased availability of these medicines, pain from advanced conditions remains under-treated. This can be due to a variety of reasons such as fears over side-effects or confusion over which opioid treatment would work best. This guideline gives clear recommendations and should instigate a real clinical change in the way opioids are prescribed."

Professor Bennett, who works between St. Gemma's Hospice and the University of Leeds School of Medicine, has been awarded a National Institute for Health Research Programme Grant to research the management of cancer pain. It will look at simple, practical steps that could help patients better control their pain. The work, to be carried out in collaboration with the University of Leeds, will involve patients who are receiving palliative care and their carers.

Professor Bennett adds, "The biggest barrier to good pain control for patients with advanced cancer is not the lack of good drugs, but inadequate support and advice, poor communication, lack of pain monitoring, and a lack of access to painkillers. By working with patients and their carers to tackle each of these issues, we hope to minimise patients' distress from pain and reduce the number of avoidable hospital admissions."


Help us to raise £2.8 mil

Where there is a Will, there is a way



October is Make a Will Month for St. Gemma's and we are again being supported by local solicitors to give you the opportunity to have your Will or Codicil written for free, in exchange for making a donation to the Hospice.

Take the opportunity to organise your wishes and assets, whilst also knowing that your donation will provide a way for St. Gemma's to continue to give the highest level of care to local people living with incurable illnesses.

Currently, only 3 in 10 people make a Will. The absence of formal arrangements can cause a lot of distress to family members at a time when they are already very upset, so Make a Will Month allows you the chance to put your affairs in order now.

There is no obligation to leave a gift in your Will to St. Gemma's, but if you choose to do so, the gift would be tax free, meaning your vital contribution would go even further towards patient care.

If you already have a Will in place but wish St. Gemma's Hospice to benefit in some way, your initial arrangements can easily be added to through a Codicil. To benefit from this offer:

1. Cut out and complete the Entitlement Voucher.
2. Arrange an appointment to be seen in October by one of the participating solicitors.
3. At the appointment, the solicitor will hand you an envelope.
4. Place the entitlement voucher and donation in to the envelope and seal it.

Donations can be made via cash, cheque or credit card.

The offer applies to standard Wills, Mirror Wills (e.g. two identical Wills written for husband and wife) and Codicils (changes made to your current Will). If you find that your Will is not standard and involves specialised legal advice, your solicitor will discuss this with you and agree a fee with you before proceeding.
