What We Do

St Gemma's is for people who have life-threatening illnesses with difficult symptoms to manage. Care is based on a simple idea – that the person is more than the illness. Each of us - sick or well - has unique physical, emotional. social and spiritual needs. St Gemma's tries to respond to these needs in ways which place the highest value on respect choice and empowerment.

Care is offered to patients and their carers in the Hospice's In-Patient Unit, through the St Gemma's community nursing and medical team and via a range of Day Services.

Care is provided by a range of specially trained staff; nurses, doctors, physiotherapists, occupational therapists. social workers, pharmacists, complementary therapists and a spiritual care team. Our expert team works together to ensure the needs of patients and carers are met. We also work closely with other care providers in the city to ensure a seamless service for patients and families.

Families and carers are supported by the Hospice's specialist bereavement workers who provide support to all, including children and young people.

In the last year, St Gemma's supported over 3,000 local people.
